

## **Golden Retriever Club of BC Puppy/Juvenile Listing Requirements**

1. Breeders must be members of the Club in good standing for at least 2 continuous years (this applies to all new members as of January 1st, 1997; Ordinary/Family Members late in renewing membership will revert to Provisional Membership for one year from date of receipt of dues and will not qualify during that one year period).
2. Breeders must be current members of the Canadian Kennel Club.
3. **As outlined in the GRCBC Code of Ethics**, Breeders must provide to all puppy buyers:
  - An appropriate certificate of examination of hip, elbow and heart clearances for both sire and dam.
  - Current annual eye clearances for sire and dam.
  - Results of any DNA testing recommended for Golden Retriever breeding stock
4. The pups/juveniles must be raised and sold according to our Club's Code of Ethics.
5. Litters/juveniles on the list must be owned, whelped (except in extenuating circumstances, e.g. c-sections) and raised at the home of the member on the Puppy/Juvenile List.
6. During the 12 month period prior to going on the Puppy/Juvenile list breeders living in the Lower Mainland between Horseshoe Bay and Chilliwack inclusive must ASSIST at a minimum of 3 Club functions, 2 of which may be attending Club meetings; Breeders living outside the Lower Mainland must ASSIST at a minimum of 2 Club functions which may include but not limited to attending meetings, articles for the Newsletter, items for the silent auction and assisting at events in their areas (or any area). ("Event" means any function hosted or sponsored by the GRCBC including, but not limited to: Specialties, Obedience Trials, Working Certificate, Hunt or Tracking Tests, Golden Days Picnic, Heart & Eye Clinics, Boosters, Awards Banquet, Silent Auction, or holding a "key" position with the club such as on the Executive, Regional Director, Puppy/Juvenile Listing Person, or assisting in any capacity such as "Assistant VP Obedience", sitting on any committees. Check the Newsletter for any events or committees coming up that you might contribute to.)
7. Inquiries through the Puppy/Juvenile List should be referred back to the Puppy/Juvenile Referral person if breeders are unable to supply dogs from their litter(s) and should not, in any event, take deposits for future litters from these inquiries.
8. Extenuating circumstances may be forwarded to the Executive for consideration.

### **Puppy List Requirements**

1. Breeders may list only three litters in each 12-month period on the Puppy List.
2. The cost to go on the Puppy Listing is \$65.00 per litter. When there are five or less pups total in the litter, the breeder may apply for a \$32.50 rebate.
3. If breeders have more than one litter available during a puppy listing, they must formally list all such litters.

### **Juvenile List Requirements**

1. A fee of \$35.00 will be required to list each juvenile dog, unless the dog was part of a litter previously listed on the puppy list, in which case there is no charge.
2. Juvenile dogs must be a minimum of 4 months with an upper limit of 32 months of age.
3. The listing of any juvenile dog will not count toward the three litters allowed per year for each qualifying Breeder/Member.
